and pay us back for all the evil  
that we did to him.”

Genesis 50:16-18

So they sent a message to Joseph, saying,  
“Your father gave this command before he died:  
‘Say to Joseph, Please forgive the transgression  
of your brothers and their sin,  
because they did evil to you.’  
And now, please forgive the transgression  
of the servants of the God of your father.”

Joseph wept when they spoke to him.

His brothers also came and fell down before him  
and said, “Behold, we are your servants.”

Genesis 50:19-21

But Joseph said to them,

“Do not fear, for am I in the place of God?

“As for you, you meant evil against me,  
but God meant it for good,  
to bring it about that many people  
should be kept alive, as they are today.

“So do not fear;  
I will provide for you and your little ones.”

Thus he comforted them and spoke kindly to them.

# The Hebrew Word for Justice:

1 Corinthians 5:14-15

For the love of Christ controls us,  
because we have concluded this:

that one has died for all,  
therefore all have died;  
and he died for all, that those who live  
might no longer live for themselves  
but for him who for their sake died  
and was raised.

1 Corinthians 5:16-17

From now on, therefore,  
we regard no one according to the flesh.  
Even though we once regarded Christ  
according to the flesh,  
we regard him thus no longer.

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ,  
he is a new creation.  
The old has passed away;  
behold, the new has come.

1 Corinthians 5:18-19

All this is from God,  
who through Christ reconciled us to himself  
and gave us the ministry of reconciliation;

that is, in Christ  
God was reconciling the world to himself,  
not counting their trespasses against them,  
and entrusting to us  
the message of reconciliation.

1 Corinthians 5:20-21

Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ,  
God making his appeal through us.  
We implore you on behalf of Christ,  
be reconciled to God.

For our sake he made him to be sin  
who knew no sin, so that in him  
we might become  
the righteousness of God.

Revelation 11:15

Then the seventh angel blew his trumpet,
