## LESSON 1: ACTS 20:1-38

## The Third Missionary Journey: Paul's Address to the Ephesian Elders

- 1. Read verses 1-3 and review Paul's journeys (and letters) to this point in his life.
- Now read verses 4-6. Why does Paul hardly ever travel alone? Why do you think he favors teamwork? What do we know about these traveling companions of his? (For Aristarchus, see Acts 19:29, 20:4, 27:2, Colossians 4:10, and Philemon 1:24; for Gaius, see Acts 19:29 (1 Corinthians 1:14, Romans 16:23, and 3 John 1:1); for Tychicus, see Acts 20:4, Ephesians 6:21, Colossians 4:7, Titus 3:12, 2 Timothy 4:12; and for Trophimus, see Acts 20:4; 21:29; 2 Timothy 4:20)
- 3. How did Paul's friends in the towns and cities which he had previously visited show their love and respect for him (vv. 1-16)? What do you think their feelings might have been? (See also 20:36-38.) What good examples do you see here for the way churches should function, and the way in which believers should treat each other (vv. 1-12)?
- 4. What does the incident recounted in vv. 7-12 tell you about early Christian worship? (Compare Paul's words in v. 10 with Jesus' words in Mark 5:39.) Why would Paul be hoping to arrive in Jerusalem in time for Pentecost (v. 16)?
- 5. What actions and attitudes had Paul practiced which should serve as a model for Christian leaders (vv.17-27, 33-35)?
- 6. What three titles does Paul use in addressing the Ephesian Church leaders (vv. 17,28a, and 28b)? What do these terms mean? How are they used and put into practice today?
- 7. Why is Paul going to Jerusalem (v. 22-24)? What is the role of the Spirit in this? What do you make of this? Is this something we should (or can) expect today?

- 8. What is more important to Paul than personal survival (v. 24)? What is most important to you?
- 9. What does it mean when Paul declares that he is innocent of their blood (vv. 25-27)? Compare this with Ezekiel 3:18-21, 33:2-9, and Acts 18:6.
- 10. What warning does Paul repeat and why (vv. 28-38)? How contemporary is this warning? What would protect the elders then and today?
